Death Café We had James McHarg from Baker Wilson Davies in to chat with us in July about Estate Planning. James was a delight, and we had a huge turnout for that first session. There were questions on Wills, and how and when they are valid. Power of Attorney and Enduring Guardianship were the other topics and it was very insightful. Our next Death Café starts next Monday and runs every Monday throughout August. Michelle will be talking about Advanced Care Directives and the importance of having plans in place that account for your wishes in any change to your health. It's straight after Soup with Soul, and there will be CAKE!

New Service at GeCo - GeCo is now a Tasmanian Secondary Needle and Syringe Program provider. The Tasmanian Needle and Syringe Program is a public health initiative that aims to prevent and reduce the transmission of blood-borne viruses, and the occurrence of other injecting related harms, through the provision of free and accessible sterile injecting equipment across the state. GeCo has three staff members certified to provide injecting equipment ensuring there will always be someone here to assist you during our regular opening hours Mon - Fri.

Services Australia will be returning to GeCo Monthly, and their next visit is on the 21st of August, during Soup with Soul. Come and have a chat if you have any queries about Centrelink or any other government service. Services Australia have a quiet room and can chat to you confidentially.

Our Learner Driver Mentor program is called Jumpstart, and it allows us to provide free driver mentoring to people who are on their L's. Learner drivers need 80 hours of instruction and practice, including 15 hours at night, over a 12 month period before they can sit for their P Plates.

GeCo has an amazing group of Mentors – members of the community who volunteer their time to be the passenger while a learner driver gets their hours up. Our Mentors also help with theory and test preparation. We provide training for the mentoring in the car, and also other areas, like mental health and communication.
