Geeveston Community Workshop

Everyone in the Workshop has been extra busy this month. New Supervisor **Jan** has hit the ground running and is offering Machine-free Mondays! Anyone having issues with their hearing, or sensory sensitivities, this is the day to go and try your hand and whittling, carving or any other handcraft without the distraction of machinery running. It's a great concept and we can't wait to see people taking advantage of it.

Laurie is in on Tuesdays for Lad's Day – men only! It's a day where men can be in a safe space to discuss anything they like, judgement free and a focus on mental health and wellbeing.

Geoff and Aga ran another of our most awesome induction sessions where participants made a tealight holder. These induction sessions are great for building confidence in using the machinery and to let the participant get a feel for what they would like to do when they start to woodwork. This teardrop holder allows the participant to use most of the machinery in the shed, consequently allowing signoff on safety and good practice.

We've had **Michael** running a Traditional Woodworking with Handtools Course which ran for 3 weeks and talked about maintenance, what to look for when shopping second-hand, joints and myriad other topics for the hand-tool aficionado!

Shirley has been doing MOUNTAINS of work in the background getting all of our paperwork up to date and compliant. When she isn't neck-deep in forms, she has found the time to run a DIY workshop for the LGBT++ Community, as well as crafting these awesome little membership fobs for financial members of the Shed.

Flick has been focussed on Christmas and will be running a workshop in October, making various Christmas Ornaments and Gifts, with Shirley. It's a cracking activity and a practical way to use up little offcuts of wood. Let's face it – everyone loves a handmade gift!



All our supervisors are here to support the participants of the shed, and are well versed in referring people on to the centre, should anyone need more specific or acute support. We'd like to do a shoutout to all the champions who support the Geeveston Community Shed. In particular, **Matt, Jim and Cara** who have all made sizeable donations recently of timber and offcuts that make a HUGE difference to our shed. Even offcuts can be turned into an induction project and we're just so grateful for the donations we receive.

Jumpstart

Our Learner Driver Mentor program is called Jumpstart, and it allows us to provide free driver mentoring to people who are on their L's. Learner drivers need 80 hours of instruction and practice, including 15 hours at night, over a 12 month period before they can sit for their P Plates.

GeCo has an amazing group of Mentors – members of the community who volunteer their time to be the passenger while a learner driver gets their hours up. Our Mentors also help with theory and test preparation. We provide training for the mentoring in the car, and also other areas, like mental health and communication.

Congratulations to **Judy** and to **Bryony** who have just passed their test! Thanks as well to the mentors who helped them get there.

Details of my username, email address, digital assests and action required. This would be useful for anyone to keep track of emails/ passwords etc, which would certainly be good for me!

The hour-long course finished with 'my money online' and 'my other online accounts and subscriptions' plus how to keep all this information safe which is something we all need to understand. It was well worth an hour of my time and the peace of mind to know how to keep my information safe. GeCo's next 'My Digital Legacy' workshop is at 11.00am on Friday 29th September.
