NBN Co Launches FTTP

In September we were delighted to host NBN Co, Telstra and Ventia - partners behind the extensive internet infrastructure upgrades that mean Geeveston now has Fibre to the Premises, or **FTTP**.

Sally Doyle, Mayor of the Huon Valley, and Jordan Cripps from Julie Collins office were also on hand to celebrate the launch, which was followed by a Digital Literacy Session run by Devansh Sharma - a GeCo regular. And the support doesn't stop there! A number of our community have had Telstra follow up on upgrades and mobile plans.

Julie Collins said of the upgrades, "It is wonderful to see the completion of NBN's work to upgrade Geeveston to full fibre internet, made possible by a \$1 million grant from the Federal Government. Fast, reliable internet is a vital tool in helping regional communities like Geeveston stay connected to essential services like telehealth and education opportunities. Labor designed and built the NBN with the intention of giving everyone access to high quality and reliable internet – I am proud to be in Government again and working hard to deliver the NBN that Tasmanians deserve."

For those who missed out, Telstra and NBN will be back at GeCo in November on the 7th and 8th. Keep a lookout for the Telstra van parked out the front! We also have Devansh from nbn Co coming in to do a VR demonatration, Wednesday the 8th at 11, followed by an afternoon tea with Julie Collins from 2pm!


Mahjong at GeCo

FAR SOUTH MOBILE COMMUNITY HUB

Dover and South Action Group, in collaboration with Geeveston Community Centre and Community Bank Huon Valley (Bendigo Bank), is proud to announce the establishment of their new community facility on wheels, bringing essential services, information, and opportunities to the Far South and Huon Valley areas. With the additional partnership of Health Consumers Tasmania, the Hub will be attended by a qualified Community Connector to provide a safe and convenient early support system for community members of all ages who may be seeking access to health information or specialist support services or who may be experiencing difficulty navigating the service system, may require access to emergency food relief or assistance, or just want to drop in for a cuppa and a chat.

Numerous service providers have already put their hands up to utilise this space, allowing physical access to services and assistance in a way that hasn't been seen in Far South Tasmania previously.

Construction of the Far South Mobile Community Hub is already underway and is expected to be completed in March 2024.

Baptcare/NDIS



Jumpstart

Our Learner Driver Mentor program is called Jumpstart, and it allows us to provide free driver mentoring to people who are on their L's. Learner drivers need 80 hours of instruction and practice, including 15 hours at night, over a 12 month period before they can sit for their P Plates.

GeCo has an amazing group of Mentors – members of the community who volunteer their time to be the passenger while a learner driver gets their hours up. Our Mentors also help with theory and test preparation. We provide training for the mentoring in the car, and also other areas, like mental health and communication.





Musculoskeletal Australia

Musculoskeletal Australia (MSK), the Australian Rheumatology Association and Painaustralia have partnered on the 2023 National Musculoskeletal Consumer Survey, which was launched on Tuesday, 31 October 2023.

The survey aims to provide insight into the lives and issues impacting people with muscle, bone and joint conditions, like arthritis, back pain and gout, to name a few. It builds on MSK's baseline survey (2020) and will explore one of the most significant issues highlighted by respondents at that time - the financial impacts of these conditions on people's lives.

The knowledge gathered will enable MSK and key stakeholders to respond to the needs of people living with muscle, bone, and joint conditions.
